Message from the President



Change can be intimidating, but it also represents a broadening of opportunities. At the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation, we've been reflecting on the changes and new opportunities we have experienced over the past year, including the transition to a new, full-time Executive Director, the retirement of a long-time trustee and the introduction of a new trustee, the completion of the ARC, and the beginning of its benefit to the community. With change comes growth and that growth is something which will benefit the Foundation and our communities for years to come.

In 2006, the Foundation was pleased to award the record amount of \$77,400 through our scholarship program, enabling many students to pursue higher education. We were thrilled to watch as the Maquoketa Area Family YMCA/ARC was built and to see it open its doors to the community. The ARC signifies the largest commitment our Foundation has made to one entity, and is an excellent example of the quality of life projects our Foundation is proud to support.

2006 also saw the completion of the Preston EMS building project—providing my hometown with a facility for our emergency personnel (many of whom are volunteers) to receive adequate training and to house important resources, including the Preston-Miles ambulance. The Foundation was pleased to support this project through a multi-year grant. This pledge, along with the hard work and fundraising efforts by the community, helped provide Preston with a beautiful facility—which will benefit the Preston area for years to come.

From large projects such as these, to the grants we make to area food pantries, for park renovations that benefit area children, to bringing the first Habitat for Humanity house to Jackson County—your contributions assist our communities where the need is greatest. The Community Foundation offers all citizens the opportunity to make a contribution, large or small, to meet needs now, and into the future. Being President of the Board has allowed me the opportunity to be a part of this effort, and has proven to be a most rewarding role.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I am pleased to present the 2006 Maquoketa Area Community Foundation Annual Report.

Message from the Director



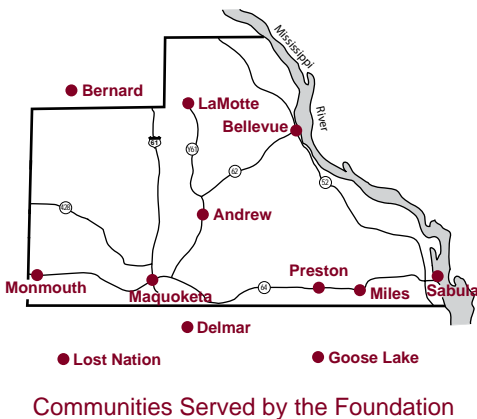

MAQUOKETA AREA FAMILY YMCA (ARC)

In 2007, the Maquoketa Area Family YMCA opened their doors to an enthusiastic response from those interested in health, fitness and fun. This grassroots volunteer project survived many changes in drafts, plans, blueprints and footprints but the entity that inhabits the corner of East Summit Street and South Matteson Street is finally a reality.



The Maquoketa Area Family YMCA opened their doors in late October, and is ramping up their programs to include youth, adult, senior and family programs, health and wellness activities, youth leadership development, swimming and sports classes, and wholesome family fun.



The MACF has pledged their support of this quality of life project with two separate multi-year pledges, totaling \$300,000. The Board of Directors feels that this investment will pay off long into the future by improving the health of Jackson County residents, and serve as an asset when families consider relocating to this area.



The MACF is also proud to hold funds benefiting the ARC/YMCA. Community members' pledges to the capital project continue to be paid through the Foundation, and the Foundation also holds a permanent endowment fund for the ARC/YMCA. Annually, the YMCA will promote their Partners With Youth campaign separately from these funds, collecting funds to provide low-income families with memberships and access to programming.



NEED SOME FUNDS? EARNS CVC AWARD

The MACF was awarded with a Best Practice commendation from the Iowa State University Extension Community Vitality Center for their *Need Some Funds?* e-mail group.

With the MACF serving as a resource and supporter of area non-profit organizations, establishing this email group was a way of communicating new grant opportunities to all of their contacts.

As a part of this award, the MACF was present on a Best Practices panel at the CVC Philanthropy Academy and the Foundation received a \$1,000 award.

PRESTON EMS

In 2006, the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation made a \$15,000 multi-year commitment to the Emergency Medical Services building in Preston.

This is the first time the Community Ambulance Service has had their own facility, which has space for two ambulances, a training room and sleeping quarters.

The Community Ambulance Service has been in existence since 1976 and has provided ambulance coverage to Preston and surrounding communities 24 hours a day, 365 days a year – all with volunteer personnel.



MACF ACHIEVES NATIONAL STANDARDS ACCREDITATION

During Kate Carinder's term as Executive Director, she and the Board of Directors completed the arduous task of achieving compliance with the National Standards for U.S. Community Foundations. The MACF was awarded compliance in April of 2006.

Statewide, there are 12 community foundations that have made compliance with these standards, which focus on legal, ethical and effective operation practices that show the Foundation's transparency and financial responsibility. Approximately 100 Iowa foundations chose to affiliate themselves with larger CFS foundations rather than pursuing compliance on their own.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY ESTABLISHES A PRESENCE IN JACKSON COUNTY

Alliance Pipeline has served as a charitable partner to the community since establishing operations in Maquoketa in 1999. They saw the need for affordable housing in Jackson County and posed a \$25,000 challenge grant to the community to build the first Jackson County Habitat For Humanity home. The MACF is proud to support this worthy project.

Through volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat for Humanity builds and rehabilitates simple, decent houses with the help of the homeowner (partner) families. Habitat houses are sold to partner families at no profit and financed with affordable loans. The homeowners' monthly mortgage payments are used to build additional Habitat homes. Habitat is not a giveaway program. In addition to a monthly mortgage payment, homeowners invest hundreds of hours of their own labor – sweat equity – into building their Habitat house, as well as the houses of others.



THE UNRESTRICTED GIFT

All gifts made to the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation are appreciated, and are applied to the fund of the donor's choosing. However, of all the funds held by the MACF, the **Unrestricted Fund** has the most meaningful impact on community needs. Gifts to the **Unrestricted Fund** are used to grant money to the many non-profit organizations and civic groups making a difference in the lives of Jackson County residents every day. The **Unrestricted Fund** will meet the needs of our communities today and will be responsive to the communities' needs long into the future.

IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER EXTENDED THROUGH 2008

The IRA Charitable Rollover allows IRA owners age 70½ and up to make charitable contributions up to \$100,000 from their Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) or Roth IRAs. The donor does not have to report the distribution as taxable income, and is not entitled to claim a charitable income tax deduction for the gift.

The IRA rollover, when combined with the Endow Iowa tax credit program, makes a very attractive opportunity to benefit your favorite charity's endowment fund. According to the National Committee on Planned Giving, as of June 2007, the existing rollover has encouraged Americans to give more than \$75 million in contributions.

The rollover has been extended through the end of 2008, and could be extended or made permanent. For more information, please contact the MACF office.

CREATE A FUND

Most funds are named for the donor, the donor's family, or as a memorial to someone special. If you prefer anonymity, you may choose a name that reflects your fund's charitable purpose. You may direct your gift broadly or specifically to issues you care about or to wherever the needs are greatest.

An endowed fund will reduce dependence on annual gifts and ensure that future needs will be met. It will also assure future donors of the fund's permanence. For more information about creating a fund, please contact the Foundation office.

GIVING TO THE FOUNDATION

Giving to the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation can be accomplished through a variety of ways. Almost any type of asset may be a charitable contribution, including cash, real estate, tangible property, or stocks and bonds. The Foundation can also be named as the beneficiary or co-beneficiary of a life insurance policy, individual retirement account or gift annuity. A professional advisor specializing in estate planning can help donors choose the method that is right for them.

Contributions or memorial gifts may be mailed to or dropped off at Maquoketa State Bank, USBank Maquoketa, Iowa Bank Bellevue, Bellevue State Bank, or the MACF office. Checks should be made out to the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation. Please indicate which fund you are interested in supporting, or your contribution will be added to the unrestricted fund, which provides for grants to community projects and organizations.

COUNTY ENDOWMENT FUND

The **County Endowment** fund was established during the 2004 Legislative Session in an effort to build the community foundations throughout all of Iowa's counties, to encourage and assist philanthropic activity throughout the state. While the MACF was already in existence, many community foundations were formed as a result of this funding. The Foundation was first organized in 1982 with just a few small contributions, and has steadily grown its assets to over \$4 million.

County Endowment funds have been distributed to the 85 Iowa community foundations (those counties who do not have gaming facilities in their county), with a total of \$5.7 million being distributed in 2006. That amount was divided equally, and the MACF received \$67,250. Of this amount, 25% was required to be invested in a permanent endowment fund, with the other 75% distributed to charitable causes or organizations throughout the foundation's service area. These funds, added to the spendable income of the funds held at the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation, allowed us to distribute nearly \$150,000 throughout the greater Jackson County area in 2006!

ENDOW IOWA PROGRAM

The **Endow Iowa** tax credit program is another vehicle created through legislation to build permanent endowment funds at qualified community foundations, such as the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation. Endow Iowa provides eligible donors with state income tax credits worth 20% of the value of their gift. Tax credits are offered on a first-come, first-served basis until the annual total is reached.

The legislature has set aside \$2 million in credits annually through 2007, and approximately \$3 million will be appropriated annually beginning in 2008. Tax credits can be used by the donor over a five year period.

MACF-held endowment funds that have benefited from the Endow Iowa program include the Bellevue Public Library Endowment, the Ohnward Fine Arts Center Endowment, the Bernard Rescue Unit Endowment, the ARC/YMCA Endowment, the Mary Helen Merriam Stewart Scholarship and the Sacred Heart School Endowment.

of the Maquoketa Area Community Foundation. The purpose of this fund is to provide funding

for new and improved educational opportunities, innovative learning programs, pilot projects and equipment which is not a part of the standard school budget. Support of this fund can be done through bronze, silver, gold and platinum memberships – which are single or multi-year commitments. Grants are made each year for creative and imaginative teaching projects, enrichment materials and for expansion of technology linked to projects.
